Family-School Get-together: in the best interests of the children

The Family-School Get-together, an informal event, offers families and teaching staff the opportunity to interact with and get to know each other. It can take the form of morning coffee shared by teachers and parents, an entire Saturday filled with exciting programme events, or a friendly evening after a day's work. Most important is to find the time to interact. Between events you can discuss the issues that concern your child's everyday life. You can find answers to many questions—and solutions to many problems—in just one day.

We suggest you include the event in your school calendar and inform everyone as early as possible, so that you and your students can create the parent invitations together.

You can also invite the godparents, grandparents, and siblings of students to the get-together.

Just a Little is Enough

At a Family-School Get-together, teachers, parents, and students can spend time by a camp fire, arrange a sports event, or eat breakfast and create art. They can play games, clean up the school yard, do arts and crafts, and learn new skills together.



In secondary schools, teachers and students should plan the programme together, taking student opinions into consideration. When students are involved in both the realisation and marketing of an event, enthusiasm reaches all the way to the home; pupils may have ideas that would have never been thought of otherwise.



Outdoorsy

Go on an outing to some nearby woods. You can fish, pick berries and mushrooms, and sit by the camp fire. Make the school kitchen staff or the grandparents happy by offering them some of the provisions you gathered during your outing.

Pretty

Plant flowers, rake leaves, and prune trees and shrubs in the school yard. Paint the school's fences and doors or customise the rest rooms with some decorative painting.



Organise cleaning the sports equipment store, customise the equipment, and arrange a sports equipment flea market. Arrange a buffet to collect funds for new floor ball sticks or a climbing frame.



Digital

Play games and discuss security on the internet. Learn from each other, particularly from the students. Include children in planning a gaming day for the whole family. "While walking the duckboards we were full of tales and didn't have a care in the world. A couple of families became enthusiastic about hiking and surely went back to the forest again later. It was a great day."



Let students plan the Family-School Gettogether. What topics would they like to cover with teachers and parents? In what games would they like to challenge the adults?
